Transportation Logistics Hub – now live at Bridgeport Hospital

When a patient is ready for discharge, a team member (such as a nurse, care manager or unit clerk/business associate) on an inpatient unit or in the Emergency Department will enter an order for transportation into the StatCall function in the patient's Epic chart. The order will include the patient's destination (home, skilled nursing facility, another hospital or different location), along with relevant medical information and transportation needs (such as a wheelchair-accessible van). Future plans include extending the Hub to include outpatient rides.

One of the Hub's transportation logistics facilitators, who are emergency medical technicians or specially trained dispatchers, will receive the electronic order and, using a software platform, locate the appropriate ambulance, wheelchair van or taxi vendor that meets the patient's needs.

Transportation companies in each YNHHS delivery network area will use the same software platform, allowing Hub facilitators to see when a company dispatches a patient's ride, where the ride is enroute and when it arrives at the hospital. A software platform feature keeps staff

informed through notifications and allows patients' family members to receive a text message, notifying them when their loved one has left the hospital.

Improving patient flow

With real-time information, Hub facilitators can prioritize certain transportation orders. Say a patient in the Bridgeport Hospital Emergency Department is waiting for a bed on a particular unit. The transportation logistics facilitator can prioritize transportation for a patient being discharged from that unit and help free up a bed for the waiting patient sooner.

The Transportation Logistics Hub facilitators will streamline the process and work with transportation companies to ensure these patients get to where they need to be safely and in a timely fashion and will also free up staff for their other duties.

The Transportation Logistics Hub is located in the Capacity Coordination Center with Bed Management and the Y Access Transfer Center at Yale New Haven Hospital.

StatCall and Transportation Logistics Hub materials are now available. Staff at Bridgeport Hospital can now place orders for transportation into the StatCall function in the patient's Epic chart.

A look at the Ahlbin Center

The Ahlbin Center, Bridgeport Hospital's Rehabilitation Department, provides outpatient rehabilitation services including speech therapy, occupational therapy and physical therapy. The team is specialized in the care of infants, children, adolescents, adults and geriatric patients. Across the Center's five locations, they offer care for patients with orthopedic conditions, neurologic diagnoses, vestibular dysfunction and concussion, women's and men's pelvic health diagnoses, as well as the broad spectrum of oncology diagnoses and lymphedema (inclusive of early detection lymphedema screening). They also offer specialized care for patients with scoliosis and Parkinson's Disease.

Last year, the Ahlbin Center made a shift in its care delivery model. By grouping specialty therapists together in nominated locations, they are driving collaborative treatment and improved access to exceptional quality of care.

The Ahlbin Center has five locations: The Shelton location is home to the Neurorehabilitation Center of Expertise; Stratford is the Orthopedic Center of Expertise; Southport and Trumbull (at Park Avenue Medical Center) feature Oncology and Lymphedema Centers of Expertise. The Bridgeport location at Mill Hill Avenue supports all of these specialties.

For pediatric patients, bottle and breastfeeding rehabilitation services are available at the Bridgeport location in addition to physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech-language pathology for a large variety of pediatric medical/developmental diagnoses. Shelton also offers pediatric speech services.

Avangrid joins BH's effort to reduce cancer screening disparities with \$25,000 grant

The Bridgeport Hospital Foundation recently announced a \$25,000 gift from the Avangrid Foundation, the philanthropic arm of United Illuminating and Southern Connecticut Gas' parent company, Avangrid. This grant will advance cancer screening initiatives and reducing healthcare disparities and provide cervical cancer screenings for more than 300 patients this year.

Bridgeport Hospital's Primary Care Center (PCC) serves as a critical health safety net for economically challenged and vulnerable individuals in the Bridgeport community. The hospital will measure impact of the grant by tracking cervical screenings received by PCC patients as well as changes in the number of advanced disease diagnoses and mortality rates.

Library Services resources for staff

The libraries at Bridgeport Hospital, as well as Greenwich, Lawrence + Memorial and Westerly hospitals, provide access to health information resources and services that support education, research and patient care.

The libraries also promote the Yale New Haven Health care signature initiative by fostering an atmosphere of innovation, collaboration, cooperation and life-long learning in support of an academic health network. Each library is open to YNHHS faculty, students, staff and affiliates and provide easy access to thousands of electronic journals, books and videos.

Each library provides access to several shared search engines including CINAHL, ClinicalKey for Nursing and ClinicaKey for physicians, OVID Medline and PubMed. These resources allow staff to easily search for and access journal articles. The libraries also provide access to individual resources that meet the needs of unique service lines at each delivery network.

Clinical point-of-care resources including ClinicalSkills, EMMI, LexiComp and UpToDate may be accessed through individual library websites and the EMR.

YNHHS receives Transcatheter Valve Certification

YNHHS's Heart and Vascular Center is the first and only health system in Connecticut to receive Transcatheter Valve Certification by the American College of Cardiology (ACC). Recent certification at Bridgeport Hospital and recertification at Yale New Haven Hospital is affirmation of the expertise, quality and safety of care, and outstanding outcomes achieved in treating patients who need transcatheter valve replacement.

Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR) is performed at Bridgeport Hospital and Yale New Haven Hospital with patient pre- and post-care locations at Yale New Haven Health facilities across the state.

ACC certification focuses on the essential quality components pertaining to TAVR and now includes requirements for mitral valve transcatheter edge-to-edge repair (TEER) procedures. It provides a framework to ensure hospitals are meeting high quality standards for transcatheter multidisciplinary heart teams, formalized training and shared decision-making.

YNHHS' virtual food drive underway
