Opening of 3 East at Milford Campus – Bridgeport Hospital

Bridgeport Hospital unveiled its new state-of-the-art postsurgical orthopedic care unit. The opening of 3 East on the Milford Campus marked a milestone in the commitment Yale New Haven Health and Bridgeport Hospital made to Milford Hospital when it acquired it nearly five years ago.

The rooms are equipped with the latest technology and designed with patient and family comfort in mind. Each room features a tablet that allows patients to control lighting, temperature, the window blinds and their entertainment options. They can also easily communicate with their care team. Patients can be monitored remotely and will have the ability in the future to consult with providers virtually.

REACH program offers a new state-of-the-art OCD treatment clinic at Bridgeport Hospital

The REACH (Recovery, Engagement, Access, Coaching & Healing) Adult OCD/Anxiety Disorders Program at Bridgeport Hospital has been named Program of the Year by the Association for Ambulatory Behavioral Health.

The Adult OCD/Anxiety Disorders Program was established in 2023 through a collaboration between the Yale School of Medicine OCD Research Clinic and REACH. The REACH Program is funded by the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS).

The OCD/Anxiety Disorders program at Bridgeport Hospital is the only one of two dedicated intensive programs in the United States offering Exposure and Response Prevention Therapy (ERP) with medication management. ERP therapy is a behavioral therapy that gradually exposes people to situations designed to provoke a person's obsessions in a safe environment.

In addition to the OCD/Anxiety Disorders clinic, the REACH program at Bridgeport Hospital also offers an Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP), which includes Medication Management and Outpatient Group Therapy for both adults and youth.

Yale New Haven Health celebrates 1000 patients treated through the Home Hospital Program

Yale New Haven Health (YNHHS), which launched the Home Hospital program in 2022 to provide hospital-level care to patients in their homes, celebrated the 1000th patient cared-for milestone by hosting two former patients who shared their experiences with a large audience of healthcare professionals.

The Home Hospital program provides acute care to patients who would otherwise need to be in the hospital. Through a combination of in-person visits and telehealth technology, the program brings a range of hospital services to the homes of patients with heart failure, pneumonia, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, cellulitis, sepsis, COVID and other conditions.

The Home Hospital program currently serves patients meeting certain clinical and social criteria who live within 25 miles of Bridgeport or Yale New Haven hospitals.

Expanding access for non-oncology infusion

In the past, patients who needed outpatient infusion treatments for non-cancerous conditions might have to wait weeks for an appointment at Yale New Haven Health's outpatient infusion centers. The reasons for the delays and patient backlog are complex -- new medications have increased infusion demand; physician referral and scheduling processes have been inconsistent across different practices; it can take time for insurance companies to approve infusion treatments.

As for non-oncology infusion, YNHHS infusion centers provide highly specialized diagnostic and clinical care and perform more than 36,000 treatments annually for allergy and immunology conditions, rheumatoid arthritis, inflammatory bowel disease, multiple sclerosis, lupus, Alzheimer's disease, osteoporosis and other non-cancerous conditions.

Many of these treatments are the only options for patients with previously untreatable conditions. Increasing available treatments is a boon for patients and requires creating the necessary capacity.

The oncology infusion area has also faced patient throughput challenges. As with other oncology programs nationwide, Smilow Cancer Hospital patients had wait times the day of their appointments. In addition, balancing the workload among staff was difficult, particularly during peak times.

In response, staff within the oncology and non/oncology infusion areas each created multidisciplinary teams focused on two main goals: to more efficiently use infusion chairs, thereby increasing capacity and improving patient access.

Last year, a multidisciplinary team from Nursing, Pharmacy, Digital Technology Solutions, Financial Clearance and other departments began exploring ways to streamline access to infusion chairs at YNHHS outpatient infusion centers. After analyzing barriers to timely patient access, they worked with community physicians to improve communications and streamline referrals. The team is also working with YNHHS providers to facilitate scheduling at sites across the health system to provide more care closer to home and is piloting an Epic tool to improve patient scheduling.

Bridgeport Hospital nationally recognized for providing high-quality stroke care

Bridgeport Hospital has received the American Heart Association's Get With The Guidelines[®] –Stroke Silver Plus quality achievement award for its commitment to ensuring stroke patients receive the most appropriate treatment according to nationally recognized, researchbased guidelines, ultimately leading to more lives saved and reduced disability. Each year, program participants qualify for the award by demonstrating how their organization has committed to providing quality care for stroke patients. In addition to following treatment guidelines, Get With The Guidelines participants also educate patients to help them manage their health and recovery at home.

Bridgeport Hospital also received the American Heart Association's Target: Stroke Elite award. To qualify for this recognition, hospitals must meet specific criteria that reduce the time between an eligible patient's arrival at the hospital and treatment with thrombolytic therapy.

Know Your Numbers Plus 2024 underway

Yale New Haven Health's 2024 Know Your Numbers (KYN) Plus program is currently underway. The wellbeing incentive program allows benefits-eligible employees, including employed physicians, the opportunity to earn up to \$500 toward their 2025 YNHHS Medical Plan premium. Additionally, the program can provide key insights into an employee's current health status and future risks, and consists of a Biometric Screening, Online Health Assessment and personal choice activities.

Employees must complete both a Biometric Screening and an Online Health Assessment to earn any premium incentive, and the two activities will earn \$300 toward the \$500 maximum premium credit.

Employees can earn up to \$200 in additional credit (towards the maximum \$500 credit) by completing other Personal Choice Activities.

To earn credit, employees must first register on the Virgin Pulse platform. To enroll in Virgin Pulse, go to the website at join.virginpulse.com/ynhhs. If already enrolled, log in to Virgin Pulse through THRIVE on the intranet, or through Infor, under Employee Programs.

Onsite biometric screenings are available at all delivery networks through early August. Schedule appointments for a biometric screening on the Virgin Pulse portal or have a screening as part of a preventative care visit with your PCP or Ob/Gyn, or at a participating CVS Pharmacy. The Online Health Assessment is also located in the Virgin Pulse portal. The deadline for all activities to be completed is Aug. 23, 2024.
